


Oakwood Community Calendar 2014

CITY SERVICES

CITY COUNCIL

Oakwood is served by a Council-City Manager form of government. Oakwood's City Council is comprised of five members who are elected on a non-partisan basis for four-year overlapping terms. The Mayor and Vice Mayor are selected by their fellow Council members for two-year terms.

City Council is the policy-making body of the community. To implement policies and enforce ordinances, Council appoints a full-time professional City Manager. The City Manager serves as chief executive officer of the city.

PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT

Oakwood's Public Safety Department is unique in that all of our officers perform law enforcement, fire protection, and emergency medical services. All Safety Officers maintain state certification as police officers, firefighters and emergency medical technicians or paramedics. Created in 1927, Oakwood's Safety Department is the second oldest fully consolidated department in the country.

EMERGENCY CALLS

Oakwood operates a 9-1-1 emergency call center which allows direct contact with the Public Safety Department. Response time to all public safety emergencies is generally three minutes or less, the fastest response time in the greater Dayton area.

AMBULANCE/RESCUE/ PARAMEDIC SERVICE

Oakwood is an area leader in advanced emergency medical care, offering the most up-to-date equipment and training to handle cardiac, respiratory and other medical emergencies.

VACANT RESIDENCE CHECKS

Residents who will be away for periods of time can have their homes checked for security by safety officers. Please call the safety dispatcher at 298-2122 in advance or stop by the city building and speak with the dispatcher.

BICYCLE LICENSES

Oakwood bicycle licenses are issued at no charge to residents. An ownership file is maintained to help identify lost or stolen bicycles.

ALARM SYSTEMS

Permits for alarm systems are required by law and may be obtained from the Safety Department at 30 Park Avenue.

FIRE INSPECTIONS

Residents who wish to have a home fire inspection may call 298-2122 to schedule an appointment. There is no charge for this service.

SMOKE ALARMS

Smoke alarms are required to be installed and maintained in all Oakwood homes.

SPECIAL NEEDS ASSESSMENT PROGRAM

The Safety Department has a program designed to meet the special needs of citizens who are on medication, have medical conditions or are senior citizens who may need special assistance. Call 298-2122 for more information.

VOTING

You may register to vote at Wright Memorial Public Library year-round except 30 days prior to an election. Changes of address must be reported to remain eligible and you must vote at least once every four years.

MUNICIPAL COURT

Oakwood has its own Municipal Court which is part of the County and State Court System. The Clerk of Courts is open at 30 Park Avenue, Monday through Friday, for payment of traffic violation fines and filing of small claims and civil lawsuits.

WATER/SEWER

New residents must call the city building to register for water service. The city owns and operates its own Water Department. 100% of our water is softened reducing the dependency on home water softeners while improving water quality. We produce nearly all of our water from our eight city-owned wells and maintain our own sanitary sewer system. Call 298-0400 if you have utility problems or questions, or wish to sign up for e-statements and auto bill paying.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Oakwood's Public Works Department provides a wide range of municipal services unparalleled in the state.

WEEKLY BACKDOOR REFUSE COLLECTION

Oakwood maintains its charm and character through a carefully conducted refuse removal program. The result is

a clean, attractive city. To better serve you, we ask that you keep your driveway clear of obstructions on collection day. For more information on refuse collection and recycling, please see www.oakwoodohio.gov and search for "recycling handbook" or call 298-0777 with any questions.

SPECIAL PICK-UPS

Special pick-ups for items such as furniture, stoves, etc., can be arranged between January and September by calling the Public Works Department at 298-0777. As an added convenience, the City also operates a dumpster service for residents to complete home projects. These dumpsters are available for home remodeling or large amounts of brush/branch removal. Depending on material and number of pick-ups used, there may be fees associated with these services.

RECYCLING

The City of Oakwood initiated the first community-wide residential recycling program in Montgomery County. Today, recycling is widely practiced, with nearly 80% voluntary participation. Plastics, glass, newspapers, metal, paperboard, catalogs and small amounts of cardboard items may be co-mingled in separately marked "RECYCLABLES" containers for collection on your regular refuse day. Stickers are available at 210 Shafor, 30 Park Avenue, the OCC or by mail.

CARDBOARD RECYCLING

Cardboard, including broken down boxes, cereal boxes, shirt boxes, and brown paper bags, are accepted for recycling at the Creager Field parking lot adjacent to the 210 Shafor Boulevard service yard. Cardboard material should be placed in the marked containers. The drop-off location is accessible at all times.

YARD DEBRIS PICK-UP

The City collects yard debris around the city on a monthly cycle. The schedule is published in the Oakwood Scene. The material (e.g., brush, branches) should be placed between the curb and sidewalk a day or two before the published pick-up day. The city does not, however, collect grass clippings. Mulching mowers or home composting is recommended.

MULCH

In an effort to reduce dependency on area landfills, the City contracts for grinding the fall leaves into mulch. The leaf mulch is made available at the Public Works Center or delivered to residents in the spring. There is a nominal delivery fee for this service.

STREET REPAIR

Oakwood takes great pride in street maintenance. Streets are routinely swept and service crews are quick to make sure roadway surfaces are in good repair. Please call 298-0777 to report any issues.

SNOW REMOVAL

SALTING: Major streets, hills and intersections take priority with residential streets following. Under most snow conditions, all residential streets are salted.

PLOWING: During heavy snowfall, the City also plows the streets. It may be necessary to clear streets of parked vehicles.

SIDEWALK PLOWING: When there is 1 inch or more accumulation, we deploy our sidewalk plows. Plows typically make one pass through the city.

ALLEY PLOWING: Alleys are plowed after an accumulation of 4 inches or more of snow.

LEISURE SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Oakwood residents enjoy a variety of leisure activities sponsored by the City and administered through the Department of Leisure Services. Athletic and cultural activities, trips, classes, dances, health screening and more are offered throughout the year to residents of all ages. The Leisure Services Department also maintains parks, natural areas, boulevards and Smith Gardens.

The Leisure Services Department publishes a brochure of activities, classes and community events, which is delivered to all residents three times a year and available on the City's website.

COMMUNITY CENTER

The Oakwood Community Center (OCC), located at 105 Patterson Road, houses the Department of Leisure Services, and is the home of Gardner Memorial Pool. Membership in the community center allows residents to participate in classes and activities for reduced fees.

TENNIS

Tennis is a proud city tradition, with public courts at Shafor and Orchardly Parks. Instruction is provided for all ages and skill levels during the summer months. When not in use by the OCC or school tennis teams, courts are available to the public on a first-come, first-served basis.

PARKS

The City is proud of its three neighborhood parks - Shafor, Fairridge & Orchardly - and the new dog park at Creager Field adjacent to 210 Shafor Blvd. Playground equipment, landscaping, and access for the handicapped are provided.

GARDENS

Smith Gardens, which has been termed, "the finest tiny public garden in the State of Ohio" as well as the Midwest, is the cornerstone of the City's garden program. The garden includes a garden house which can be scheduled for activities. Blanket concerts, story hour and workshops also take place at Smith Gardens.

Loy Gardens, Elizabeth Gardens, Houk Stream and Francine's Garden are natural areas maintained as passive walking areas. These wooded areas are highlighted by flowing streams and wildflowers which add to the ambiance that makes Oakwood special.

JOHNNY APPLESEED TREE PLANTING PROJECT

The City of Oakwood sponsors an annual Johnny Appleseed Tree Planting Project. 2,535 street trees have been planted throughout the city since this program began. Residents have the opportunity to purchase trees at a 50% discount. The Johnny Appleseed Program is one of the reasons why our city has been named a winner of Tree City USA for 30 consecutive years.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The Finance Department is responsible for the collection and custody of all city public funds and water, sewer and stormwater funds. Fund accounts are monitored daily. Citizens with special interest in finance may serve on a volunteer Budget Review Committee to provide input on budget issues.

INCOME TAX

The City collects its own income tax of 2.5% which is levied on all income generated within the community or by Oakwood residents who work in other communities. Staff is available during business hours to answer questions about city taxes. Call 298-0531.

VITAL STATISTICS

Certified birth and death certificates are available from the Finance Department. Certificates are on file for deaths occurring within city limits and births occurring anywhere in Ohio.

UTILITY BILLING

The City provides a convenient way to receive and pay utility bills. Go paperless by having your utility bill emailed directly to you. You may also pay automatically via ACH. Contact Utility Billing at 298-0400 or visit our

city website for more information.

BOARD OF HEALTH

The City operates a local Board of Health. This five member Board is responsible for overseeing all health related programs including inspection of all food service establishments. The City Manager serves as Administrator and appoints the Health Commissioner/Medical Director.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

ZONING & CODE ENFORCEMENT

Oakwood homeowners take tremendous pride in maintaining their homes and surrounding property in first class condition. In order to protect and maintain high property values, the City enforces property maintenance standards based on national codes. These standards require exterior structures be maintained in good repair and surfaces be properly coated (paint or stain) to prevent deterioration. If you know of a property which you believe may not meet the standards and is in need of repair, contact the city inspector at 297-2920.

BUILDING/ZONING PERMITS

Most exterior improvements such as deck construction, driveway replacement, room additions, fences, sheds, patios, etc., as well as many interior improvements, including electrical and plumbing projects, require permits before construction begins. If you are considering any home improvements, please contact the zoning inspector at 297-2920 for permit information and general assistance.

PRE-SALE INSPECTIONS

Oakwood has a pre-sale inspection program which requires that any violations of the fire, zoning, property maintenance or building codes be corrected prior to the transfer of property. Violations identified during an inspection must be corrected by the seller or, alternatively, the buyer can assume responsibility. If you plan to sell your property, please contact the city inspector at 297-2920 to schedule a pre-sale inspection. There is a \$60 fee for this service.

CITY PUBLICATION

OAKWOOD SCENE is a joint publication of the City of Oakwood, Oakwood Schools and Wright Memorial Public Library and is mailed free of charge, to all residents bi-monthly throughout the year. This newsletter contains updates on city services, school related activities and library news.
